NEVADA STATE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION
PUBLIC HEARING
DECEMBER 10, 1992

The Nevada State Environmental Commission will hold a public hearing commencing 11:00 a.m., Pacific Daylight Time, (PDT) on December 10, 1992, at the Colorado Belle Casino, Mardi Gras Room, Level A located at 2100 South Casino Drive, Laughlin, Nevada.

This agenda has been posted at the Colorado Belle Casino, Mohave Generating Station in Laughlin, Nevada, Clark County Commission Chambers and Division of Environmental Protection Office in Las Vegas, Nevada and State Library and Division of Environmental Protection Office in Carson City, Nevada. The Public Notice for this set hearing was published on November 10, 1992 November 24, 1992, and December 4, 1992 in the Las Vegas Review Journal and Reno Gazette Journal Newspapers. Also the Public Notice was published in the Mohave Valley News on November 9, 1992, November 24, 1992 and December 4, 1992.

The following items will be discussed and acted upon but may be taken in different order to accommodate the interest and time of the persons attending.

- I. Approval of minutes from the September 29, and September 30, 1992 meetings. * ACTION
- II. Air Pollution - Public Hearing - * ACTION
 - A. Petition by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection to temporarily amend Section 445.724 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), to change the visible emission standard for coal fired steam generating facilities with a heat input of more than 7936 million BTU's per hour which existed prior to 1972. The regulation modifies Southern California Edison's Mohave Generating Station opacity requirements.
 - B. Consideration of petition by Mohave County to modify the Mohave Generating Station's special opacity regulation.
- III. Hazardous Waste - Public Hearing - * ACTION
 - A. Petition by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection to temporarily amend Chapter 444 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) to add a section requiring generators of greater than 100 kilograms of hazardous waste per calendar month, who accumulate hazardous waste on site, to comply with provisions of 40 CFR Part 265.73(b)(5). The amendment requires generators of hazardous waste to maintain written records and results of inspections as required by 40 CFR 265.15(d). *ACTION

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III. Hazardous Waste - Public Hearing - * ACTION

- B. Petition by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection to temporarily amend Chapter 444 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). The proposed amendment modifies NAC 444.842 to 444.960. The NAC is proposed to be amended by the adoption by reference of 40 CFR Parts 2, Subpart A, 124, Subparts A & B, and 260 to 270 inclusive as existed on July 1, 1991. The amendments correct possible conflicts, inconsistencies and exempts from adoption those federal regulations which are not delegated to the state for management of hazardous waste.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Nevada State Environmental Commission will hold a public hearing beginning 11:00 a.m. on December 10, 1992, at the Colorado Belle, Level A, Mardi Gras Room, located at 2100 South Casino Drive, Laughlin, Nevada.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulations. If there is no person directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the State Environmental Commission may proceed immediately to act upon any written submission.

1. Petition by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection to amend Section 445.724 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), to change the visible emission standard for coal fired steam generating facilities with a heat input of more than 7936 million BTU's per hour which existed prior to 1972. The regulation modifies Southern California Edison's Mohave Generating Station opacity requirements. *ACTION

Written submissions must be received at least 5 days before the scheduled public hearing.
