**Note: Small Business is defined as a "business conducted for profit which employs fewer than 150 full-time or part-time employees" (NRS 233B.0382).**

RE: Proposed Amendment to NAC 445B.6125; Certification of vehicle for exemption from motor vehicle emissions inspection and maintenance program  
By: Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles

1. Does this proposed regulation impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a small business?

ANSWER: No. The proposed regulation exempts motor vehicles which are issued special license plates from the motor vehicle emissions inspection and maintenance program. The special license plates are designated as Antique Vehicles, Street Rods, Classic Rods, and Classic Vehicles as defined by NRS 482.381, 482.3812, 482.3814, and 482.3816 respectively. Small businesses that register a vehicle with one of these plates would not have to have the vehicle emission tested, but would still be responsible for paying a one-time \$6.00 emission certificate fee, in addition to applicable registration fees.

Small businesses that operate licensed vehicle emission testing stations in Nevada would not be able to collect the inspection service fee normally charged when the affected vehicles are emission tested. However, the number of affected vehicles that are registered with the special license plates is anticipated to be low and should not pose a significant economic burden in terms of lost business to the testing stations.

2. Does this proposed regulation restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business?

ANSWER: No. The proposed regulation in no way restricts the formation, operation or expansion of a small business.
